Community impact events Carroll Summer Fun Camp

An education-based summer day camp for elementary school children, with spaces reserved for children with autism-spectrum disorders in Carroll, IA.

This camp is a fun, safe, and structured 1/2 day summer program for your child that reinforces academics while encouraging character building, leadership skills, and physical activity. This education-based, fun summer day camp was designed by local parents for children **currently in preschool through sixth grade**.

The camp, led by experienced teachers, is designed to integrate children with an autism-spectrum diagnosis (ASD) into a population of typical peers (our goal is a ratio of one typical peers for every child with an ASD). The typical peers learn patience, compassion, and leadership, while the children with an ASD learn from daily social interactions with children their own age. All children participate daily in age-appropriate academic activities that prevent them from losing skills over the summer — and hopefully help them get ahead for the upcoming school year!

In addition to academics, all campers participate in arts activities (music, drama and visual arts) and engage in a fun physical activity that gets their bodies moving —gymnastics, outdoor games, dance, drama, sports, and more! Students will participate in field trips around the community as well.

Kristen Lundstrom, parent of two FX boys, created this program when she and her husband, Joel relocated from the Kansas City area. You can make a difference at home!

Take some time in the summer to meet with your representatives or their staff when they are in the state.

Under the Rare Across America program, RDLA staff organizes meetings for rare disease advocates with their Members of Congress and/or the Member's staff. The meetings take place in the Member's district office during the month of August, while Congress is in recess from July 29th to September 8th, 2019. The RDLA team also helps to prepare advocates for their meetings, providing legislative resource materials and Hosting pre-meeting training webinars. No prior advocacy experience is necessary.

Advocates interested in participating should register between May 8th and July 3rd at www.RareAcrossAmerica.org.

The first training webinar for registered advocates, entitled "What to Expect at Your Meetings," will be hosted on July 25th.

This is the same organization that makes the appointments for NFXF for the national advocacy day. Last year, I had two in person meetings with another Rare Disease gentleman and one phone-in meeting. It didn't take much time! I'd encourage you to register and they will try to make an appointment with the congressperson when they are in your area.

FORWARD Registry & Database

Beginning in 2008 and continuing to the present, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has supported the Fragile X Clinical & Research Consortium (FXCRC) through grants designed to increase our understanding of Fragile X syndrome.

Studies of co-occurring conditions have typically focused on each condition alone by using cross-sectional data, without examining the associations with other features of FXS or without taking a systems approach. In order to conduct well-designed clinical trials that capture the entire spectrum of the disorder, the natural history of those with FXS needs to be determined. This is particularly true for adults with FXS, about whom almost nothing is known regarding life trajectory and medical complications.

FORWARD—Fragile X Online Registry With Accessible Research Database—was implemented in 2012 to fill the recognized gap in knowledge. FORWARD Registry & Database consists of a patient and family registry plus a longitudinal database populated by clinician- and parent-reported data from individuals living with FXS.

One of the best ways for families to help advance our understanding and to improve treatment is to become part of the FORWARD Registry & Database.
